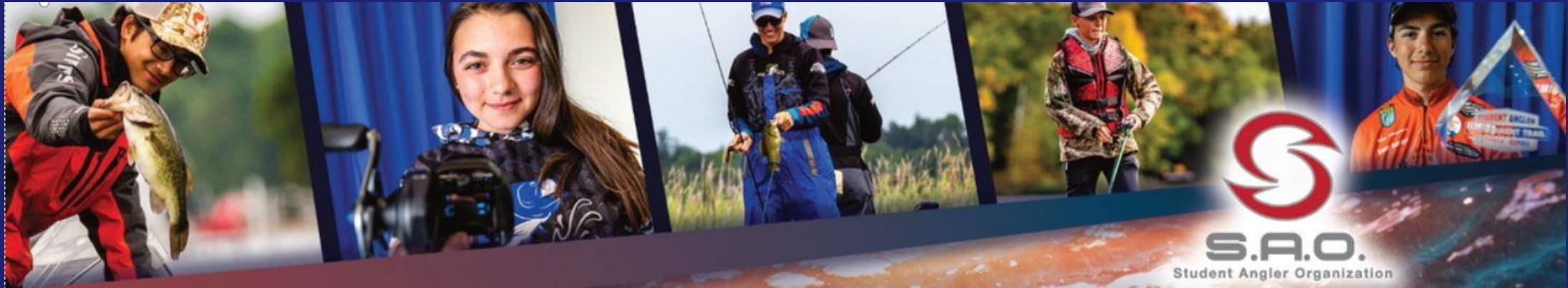

2019 Year in Review

- In 2019 the SATT ran six Qualifying events, one TOC, and one State Team Championship
- In 2019 we collected over 5,000 pounds of food, and over \$1,500 cash for food shelves at our events
- With online registration we filled four of our events in anywhere from 18 minutes to 28 minutes
- We voluntarily purchased DNR permits for all our events, and continue to work closely with the DNR and met with commissioner Sarah Strommen in October to discuss student angling initiatives
- During the season we had approximately 2,000 students that went through registration with the trail
- We had schools from International Falls to Albert Lea MN, and even our friends in ND attend
- In 2019 we presented \$29,000 in scholarships, and \$53,000 total over our first two years
- This year the SAO returned approximately \$56,000 back between scholarships, raffle, and Classic Bass events
- We paid out our first scholarship in 2019 to Kobie Koenig for \$8,000
- In 2019 we helped to start approximately 25 new school programs across the state

Safety is Number One

Lund Jersey Program

In 2019 Lund Boats covered over 900 jerseys for HS Anglers

We are looking to continue, and grow, this program in 2020, for selected teams, Lund will cover 100% of cost for first 50 jerseys

Texas HS Bass Association
Recap from Meeting on January 11th

Jimmy, Jason and Stephen

Takeaway's from THSBA Meeting

- Just to add perspective, Texas population is 5X Minnesota, and about 3X for square miles
- They run 9 divisions, five events in each division plus regional TOC and State TOC
- They were with BASS and left, then TBF for insurance and left, now insure through private
- Paid out over \$500K scholarships 2018-2019, started at 68 teams now over 1,400
- Top 50% in points from division go to regionals there are three regional TOC's
- They charge \$60 membership (includes insurance) and \$60-\$65 per event
- No rules meeting only a check-in night before, their get together is their weigh-in, ours is our rules meeting
- They allow Boat Captains to fish for big fish side pot
- They follow Safe Sport Act for 2019-2020 season, inter-state border waters creates the issue
- Will be looking at a Student Angler Exchange program, anglers to TX in winter, MN in summer

Safe Sports Act

Federal Law Feb 2018

Jimmy, Jason, Stephen and Van

The **Safe Sport Act** requires **sports** organizations to establish reasonable procedures to limit one-on-one interactions between an adult and an amateur athlete who is a minor... without being in an observable and interruptible distance from another adult.

Safe Sports Act

Mandatory Abuse Reporting within 24-Hours Policy

Establish a NO One-on-One Contact Policy for Anyone Working with Youth

Include Text in Your Waiver about Barring People on the Sex Offender Registry

Mandatory Bi-Annual Prevention Training

Recommended Background Checks

Record Keeping and Refresher Courses

Safe Sports Act

(Sec. 202) The bill designates the United States Center for Safe Sport to serve as the independent national safe sport organization.

The **center** has jurisdiction over the U.S. Olympic Committee, NGBs, and Paralympic sports organizations with respect to safeguarding amateur athletes from abuse. It must develop training, practices, policies, and procedures to prevent abuse.

NGBs must implement the policies and procedures to prevent abuse.

(Sec. 204) An amateur sports organization **that is not subject to the center's policies** and procedures to prevent abuse **must comply with certain general requirements**, including to report suspected child abuse **and to limit one-on-one** contact between an amateur athlete who is a minor and an adult.

What about local clubs that don't compete against international or out-of-state teams, does the Safe Sport Authorization Act still apply to them? Quote from Josh Opiola a noted expert in the field of Safe Sport Act

"It does. Because you have adults working with youth. And even though you do not have an affiliation with a national governing body or do not have any international or interstate travel, the requirement still does say that you need to follow the Safe Sport act requirements, which include abuse awareness training and, the biggest change, the mandatory reporting aspect of it."

Why do we partner with the TBF/SAF

Jason Bahr

With \$25 TBF membership you get entry into ANY TBF or FLW national events such as all TBF/FLW High School Open events - their home state SAF State Championship, the national championship if they qualify and the High School Fishing World Finals all with NO entry fee

The pinnacle event in all of HS fishing is the HS Fishing World Finals. Last year payout was over \$170K in scholarships and prizes and ALL SAF members can come and compete in this event

Insurance

\$1mm general liability per occurrence for ALL official club functions no limit

\$10,000 Accidental Death and Specific Loss event coverage for all members

\$1mm per occurrence 2mm aggregate of coverage for allegation of sexual abuse or molestation.

Crisis response coverage of \$25,000 per

Excess medical coverage of \$25,000 per

The Student Angler Federation has secured a Licensing Agreement with the Faculty of Fishing to expand our educational opportunities for all of our SAF members.

How the SATT helps you cover the costs

In 2019 the SATT returned over \$15,000 Cash back to teams from the raffle program

In 2019 the SATT returned approx. \$8,000 Cash back to students from the Classic Bass Events

In 2019 the SATT returned back \$4,000 Cash back to teams from the Classic Bass events

That's over \$27,000 **Cash** back to teams in 2019

On Average Approx. \$38 returned for every angler in 2019

Membership/Event Fees

TBF Membership fee is \$25 per angler and covers insurance and everything Jason laid out earlier

SATT Fee is \$40 per team (\$20 per angler) per event

More Trophies for events (Student 1st to 5th + HS 1st to 3rd + Big Bass)

Each Qualifier \$1,000 **Cash** 1st Place Team (based on 150 boat field)

Each Qualifier \$500 **Cash** 2nd Place Team (based on 150 boat field)

Food at Rules Meetings

Note: If any angler or boat captain wins more than \$600 cash in a year, they will have to file a W-2 and will receive a 1099

We will help again in 2020

Raffle off a 2020 Lund 1775 Adventure w/90hp 4-stroke Mercury

Raffle Ticket to be sold at \$20 each, here is break down

Team keeps \$5 for every ticket sold

SATT keeps \$5 for every ticket sold

Scholarship and Raffle Payouts gets \$10 for every ticket sold

Estimated 3,000 tickets = \$60,000

Scholarship and Raffle Payouts = \$30,000

Team Portion = \$15,000

SATT Portion = \$15,000

SATT Qualifying Events

Two students and one boat captain, leave from any ramp

All events are Catch Record Release (CRR)

Total weight of 7 fish each being at least one pound

Trophies awarded for First – Fifth place 2-person teams, plus Big Bass

High School Team event within each regular qualifying event

- We take top three weights from each schools 2-person teams
- Trophies for First-Third place High Schools

Team of the Year based on top three finishes, 200 pts 1st, 199 2nd, ...

Student Angler Tournament Trail TOC

Sunday August 23rd Mille Lacs Lake

Top 10% from each event qualify for TOC

Catch Record Release (CRR) format

Change this year to a Single Day event

Total weight of 7 fish each being at least one pound

Approx. \$25,000 in Scholarships and Trophies awarded
for First – Fifth place

Minnesota State Team Championship

Pelican Lake, Orr MN Sept 19-20th

Each School invited to send up to three 2-person teams

Teams share pre-fishing info and use strategy for each day

Total weight for school across the three teams each day

Two-day event combining weights for each day

Take off and return to same location for this event

Take off order set by HS Team standings from qualifiers

Qualifying for TBF/SAF National Event

Based off Team of Year (TOY) points

Points for each qualifying event based on placement, 1st is 200, 2nd 199...
and on down.

Top three finishes are added together for TOY

For every 25 unique boats the SATT can send one team, if there are 360
unique teams, we can send 14, minus any teams that have already
qualified through TBF/SAF

Team of the year points are award for the same 2-person team and can
not be combined if you have a different partner for an event

We do have rules, but we are doing
our best to keep them simple
